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〔講義の目的〕

English Expression aims to provide opportunities for students to engage in real-world English activities for a fictional company. By the end of the course, students will be able to design, market, and advertise a project in English, by working together in a team.

[講義の概要]

Throughout the course, students will work in teams to create and promote a project of their own design. Each student will take turns controlling the team as a team project manager, and each team will accomplish a group task at the end of each of four stages. Students will also prepare an English resume and practice interviews at the end.

[履修上の留意点]

"The proof is in the pudding," as we say in English. "Tests" are worthless compared to real-life English-language situations. Students who cannot express their own ideas will be cut off from industry and business deals in Asia, Europe, and throughout the world. Positive "can-do" and "never give up" attitudes essential!

〔到達目標〕

- 1. Design a project and conduct surveys of classmates in English
- 2. Analyze and present survey data in English
- 3. Create an "infomercial" about a project and do an interview in English
